爭協緩保先鋒 共創綠色校園

環保意識和可持續發展是 21 世紀的重要課題。本校注重綠色教育,培養學生的環保意識,鼓勵師生在日常生活中把環保意識付諸行動。透過多元化的環保教育活動,我們希望學生明白平衡環境保育與都市發展的重要性,培養關愛和尊重自然萬物的態度,盡世界公民的責任。

本校參加由「環保觸覺」主辦的「無冷氣夜 2020」活動。「無冷氣夜」始於 2010 年,希望透過鼓勵市民關掉一晚冷氣,喚醒市民的環保意識,反思曰常生活用電模式, 明白節約能源的重要,從而身體力行減少溫室氣體排放,一起對抗全球暖化。活動開始 前,本校鼓勵學生閱讀相關主題的文章,了解溫室效應對環境的影響。活動已於 10 月 9 曰晚上 7 時舉行,全校師生一起在家關掉冷氣,踏出改變第一步!

為了提高同學的環保意識和推動廢物回收,本學年環境教育組繼續在各課室設有紙張回收監及在操場設置三色廢物分類回收桶,每班定期安排環保風紀將紙張回收籃的廢紙放到操場的廢紙回收箱,鼓勵師生一同實踐環保精神。此外,為了共創綠色校園,提高同學們的減廢意識,本校於10月6日至13日舉辦「月餅罐回收計劃」,呼籲同學將月餅罐帶回校,由環保大使收集,並放進校內的回收箱,最後由環保署安排的承辦商「碧瑤廢物處理及回收有限公司」進行處理和收集。

除環保行動的踐行外,同學們在環保競賽方面亦取得不錯的成績。5A 班司徒穎茵同學參加由「樹賢基金有限公司」舉辦,「政務總署」、「灣仔區青年活動委員會」贊助的「環保生活問答比賽 2020」,榮獲中學組亞軍。5A 班吳雅鑫同學及 2D 班江旻珊同學則取得優異獎,表現值得嘉許。

One noticeable difference between Hong Kong and Hungarian teenagers is that they can talk with people who are older than them quite freely. They don't feel stressed, even when they are facing their teachers. In Asian culture, we must talk to older people politely. I think it is good because it will make the relationship between teachers and students closer. Also, the school rules are not strict and students have greater freedom. For instance, they can play music in the break time between lessons. That's why they love the school (maybe), and I love it too.
